Submit to One Another

[Eph 5:21 ESV] 21 submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.

- I. Intro
 - A. A key element in understanding unity in the church, proper order and submission
 - B. When we yield our own will, for the sake of the mission, we find the peace of Christ
 - C. The Challenge: SUBMIT TO ONE ANOTHER AS A DEMONSTRATION OF THE LOVE WE HAVE FOR GOD
 - D. Submit as an example.
 - E. Submit as a ministry
 - F. Submit as the result of your reverence for God and belief in His plan!
- II. Text

 - 1. Greek: Hypotasso: be subject to
 - 2. To arrange the proper order
 - 3. To Yield to advice from another
 - 4. This word brings about an immediate rebellious response when misapplied:
 - a) The application here is to willfully submit because God is good.
 - b) WILLFULLY Allowing God's word and plan to put things in proper order
 - c) Many times we reject that which we do not understand:
 - (1) We misunderstand because it has been misused, abused, and weaponized
 - (2) We have seen FORCED SUBMISSION, SHAMED SUBMISSION, and DEMANDED SUBMISSION
 - (3) This is not a Biblical response to this word.
 - (4) Because we have seen bad examples of this sacred truth, we reject the actual truth...
 - 5. Willful Submission:
 - a) When you recognize you cannot save yourself, you willfully submit yourself to God's plan for salvation
 - b) When you find yourself Helpless and hopeless, you willfully submit yourself to God's strength and power
 - c) Willful submission is a state of mind that we can find ourselves in due to circumstances, but we should choose it rather than be forced into it.
 - C. To one another
 - 1. The direction to our submission, OTHERS
 - 2. This is the challenge to do that which is going to build effectiveness in the church and blessing for the follower.
 - D. Out of reverence for Christ
 - 1. The reason for our submission
 - 2. Christ's example before the Father is our example of submission
 - 3. As we revere Christ, we yield to Him and others.

III. Points

- A. Submission Brings Godliness
 - 1. To Submit to another is a demonstration of strength
 - 2. Willingly yielding yourself for the cause of Christ is clearly a mark of the Spirit's work in your life.
 - 3. Spiritual fruit manifest itself in the believer:
 - a) In selfless service
 - b) In purity of purpose
 - c) In appropriate actions
 - 4. We become more like God when we follow God's plan

- 5. Submission to others can be refusing to react harshly when they may have earned a harsh response.
- B. Submission Brings Unity
 - 1. Ways we demonstrate unity in the church:
 - a) Submission to one another
 - b) Submission to baptism
 - c) Submission to the Lord's Supper
 - d) Submission to God
 - 2. When we choose submission to God's will and plan, we are choosing unity with God.
 - 3. When we choose unity with God, we choose submission to His plan for the church, and for peace for ourselves.
 - 4. When we have things in proper order, we find peace that only Christ can provide:
 - a) When we allow our God to put things in His proper order, we find His blessing.
 - b) We will never find peace with God our our relationships if we do not learn to submit to one another out of reverence for Christ.
- C. Submission Brings Blessing
 - 1. When you serve in the proper order and plan of God you find the blessing of God
 - 2. God has a plan, God's plan is best, God's plan is blessed.
 - 3. We do not have to come up with a new plan, we have to submit ourselves to God's plan.
 - 4. Submit to God's plan for salvation: Substitutionary Atonement
 - 5. Submit to God's plan for obedience: Baptism, and a step every day
 - 6. Submit to God's plan for a reminder of His promise: The Lord's supper
 - a) Submit to this relationship
 - b) Submit to God, and find joy.
